TOPIC: Collision Course

COMPUTING -

Touch Typing – in this unit, we will practise important keyboard skills which the children will need throughout the year.

We are Architects - in this unit, the children will research examples of architecture, before using 'Trimble SketchUp' to create their own virtual model of the Titanic. They will select, use and combine a variety of software on a range of digital devices and use the gallery to exhibit their own artwork.

SCIENCE

Light - The children will study how light travels and how we are able to see. Also, how shadows are created and change.

Electricity - The children will investigate and make circuits with different features and recognise the impact when components on the circuit are modified.

Throughout both topics, we will continue to explore how to 'work scientifically'.





Working Scientifically Skills

MATHS

Topics covered this term will be:-

- Place value, ordering, rounding
- Roman numerals
- Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of whole and decimal numbers
- Money and real-life problems
- Fractions, decimals and percentages including the addition and subtraction of fractions
- Ratio and proportion
- Handling data probability, bar charts, pie charts, line graphs etc
- Shape and reasoning about shape.
- Please encourage your child to use Times Tables Rockstars to support their multiplication knowledge.

ENGLISH

- In English this term the children will be completing a series of written tasks based around our topic of 'The Titanic.'
- Pupils will complete a diary from the point of view of a passenger on the Titanic, beginning before they board and encompassing a detailed description of the liner. They will also write a newspaper report about the tragedy using historical facts and language of the time.
- The children will continue to have comprehension and a grammar lesson weekly to build their understanding and prepare them for their KS2 assessments.

Weekly homework tasks will cover punctuation, spelling and grammar.

GEOGRAPHY

Through mapping the journey of the Titanic:

 Use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world.



Art

Through work on Titanic advertising posters and sketching of the liner the children will:

- •Use drawing techniques to convey a variety of sources, eras and cultures including observation, photographs and digital images.
- •Draw in: sketching pencils, fine liners.
- •To begin to use strategies to create perspective.

Key Skills

- To be aware of key placement/use of their body parts and equipment, in a range of activities including throwing and catching.

HISTORY

Through the topic 'Collision Course' Year 6 will be exploring the history of the Titanic. We will cover aspects of learning such as:

- Its construction who built it, where and how it was built
- Voyage ready looking at the supplies, the different roles and all the preparations before it set sail
- Mapping its maiden voyage and locating key destinations using grid references
- How the ship sank and how it might have been avoided

The aftermath and potentially who was to blame? This will also link to our oracy work and take the form of a debate.

As part of the 'Collision Course' topic the children will adapt recipes to create a range of savoury dishes to enjoy as part of our 'Titanic Dining' experience. They will:

- •Understand the principles of a healthy and varied diet.
- •Prepare and cook (rolling, mixing, kneading, grating, chopping, sieving), a variety of predominantly savoury dishes using a range of cooking techniques (baking).
- •Select from and use a wider range of tools and equipment to perform practical cooking e.g. knives, chopping board, grater, bowl, weighing scales, sieves and cutters
